About Women's Aid Leeds

In 1972, a group of local women set up Leeds Women's Aid to support women and children affected by domestic violence and abuse. In 1973, they opened the first women's refuge in the UK outside of London. 50 years later, Women's Aid Leeds continues to support families affected by domestic violence and abuse to live safe lives, free from abuse.


